CHURCH COUNCIL minutes
April 20, 2023 5:30 Meeting

Devotions by Pastor and Council

The meeting was called to order by President Tim Kenyon with the following members in attendance: Gary Boschee, Randy Cook, Raquel Linch, Sherri Nissen, Claudia Peppers, Sandi Sickels, Chuck Taylor, and Pastor Evan. Arlan Biere was in attendance. Chris Lane, Mike Linch, Deb and Emma Pantini were absent.

Approve the agenda: M/S/C by Sandi Sickels and Randy Cook

Approve March council minutes: M/S/C by Raquel Linch and Claudia Peppers as amended with the correct spelling of Chuck Taylor under Old Business C – Insurance Quotes

Treasurer's Report by Randy Cook

All bills are paid, and everything is current.

The Year End Report is still being worked on.

Randy reported with great regret he is resigning as the church Treasurer effective June 30

Old Business:

Media Com/Windstream Quotes: the current plan being used will continue as is.

Insurance Quote Cuck Taylor: The current insurance plan expires May 1, 2023. Current plan will be \$5,885 plus workman's comp. The property committee and Chris Lane met with Ed Hansen, representing MinistryFirst Brotherhood Mutual, an American Church Group to compare policies. The committee is recommending this quote of \$5,356 with workman's comp. M/S/C by Randy Cook and Gary Boschee to go with Ed Hansen, MinistryFirst adding all optional coverages, but Worldwide Extensions. (listed on the last page of the policy)

Christmas Tree Placement: the property committee recommends a real tree with placement on the tile due to the ease of clean up, more room on the altar, moving the lecture, and safety with using the ladders on the few steps. Arlan Biere spoke on behalf himself and others concerns stating the tree needs to be in a prominent place in the front of the church to be seen as it is a representation of Christ. Pastor Evan stated there is no theological reason the tree should be on the altar, and we could brainstorm arrangement of the lectern and other things at the altar. Arlan would like to have a congregational vote. It was suggested to possibly have a survey made and ready to share this fall. **Item has been tabled until the July/August meeting.**

New Business:

May Benevolence: M/S/C by Sandi Sickels and Chuck Taylor to give 4% of the benevolence to an area family in need with the remaining 6% to synod.

Fellowship Hall Usage: M/S/C by Randy Cook and Claudia Peppers use by Gail and Roxie Peterson at no charge for a Celebration of Life service for Dean Peterson May 27, 2023

Fellowship Hall Usage M/S/C by Raquel Linch and Gary Boschee by Jodi Hitz for ServeSafe Training November 13, and 14 or 16 (working out this date with quilters)

Fellowship Hall Usage M/S/C by Chuck Taylor and Randy Cook for elections September 12 and November 7, 2023

Office Equipment: M/S/C by Randy Cook and Chuck Taylor for Brenda to spend up to \$350 for an office chair.

Electronic Giving through Venmo or PayPal. Pastor has also learned of an electronic tithe at no cost. **Item will be tabled until the May meeting.**

Property on going Projects:

M/S/C by Randy Cook and Sandi Sickels to accept the bid from Alan Gates at approx. \$1900 to repair/run a line to the outside sign and replace the lights in the sanctuary with LED lighting. He will work in conjunction with Randy McIllravey when he does the dirt work (trenching the line) M/S/C by Randy Cook and Gary Boschee to accept the quote from Simmons Construction of \$5185 + \$50 per hour, understanding the cost can go up to \$7,200 quickly to sheet rock and repair the alcoves in the sanctuary. (The intention is to repair it correctly not knowing what will be found once they start the job)

M/S/C by Randy Cook and Claudia Peppers for window glazing and painting by Carl Peterson of Lenox. He is the only person in the area that would do this and would need to do a few windows first to give an estimate based on time it take per window.

M/S/C by Sandi Sickels and Raquel Linch for Alan Gates to repair kitchen circuits. Cost estimate unknown as current circuits and boxes are old and discontinued.

Projects already approved and funded through memorials are food shelf (to begin April 26) and playground repair. Brenda has volunteered to plant flowers along the south windows as she divides plants at home. Sherri will help her.


