With September, summer is coming to a close. While that means summer break is over, it also means Salem's Rally Sunday is right around the corner! For our 2023 Rally Sunday, I want us to consider these words from the Bible, Hebrews 10:23-25. Below is the CEB translation with the verse numbers in parentheses.

(23) Let's hold on to the confession of our hope without wavering, because the one who made the promises is reliable. (24) And let us consider each other carefully for the purpose of sparking love and good deeds. (25) Don't stop meeting together with other believers, which some people have gotten into the habit of doing. Instead, encourage each other, especially as you see the day drawing near.

Sometimes pastors and congregations use this passage from Hebrews to try to guilt people into attending Sunday service more often. I don't believe that is the spirit of what scripture is trying to say. The preceding verses before verse 25 help us see understand what the biblical author is trying to communicate. We gather as believers not just to show up, but that we may remind each other our purpose as church; a purpose of sparking love and good deeds, knowing our hope is in the Jesus Christ. When we rally together under common purpose, we encourage each other on our journeys as disciples.

Who in your neighborhood needs to be encouraged? Invite them to rally with us! How can we as the church encourage you on your discipleship journey? Let's chat! Because that is what the church is all about.

#### Old Business:

Electronic Offering: status will be reviewed in September.

Christmas Tree Planning was reviewed. After much prayer, deliberation, and discussion Council felt that based on safety concerns associated with accessibility, with Safety concerns associated with removing/replacing the lectern, and with having a large tree located at the altar level weighed in favor of placing the tree in the east area of the sanctuary. Placement in the east area of the sanctuary was also noted to be more consistent with Theological considerations.

M/S/C by Raquel L and Mike L for the Christmas tree to be placed in the east area of the sanctuary. By unanimous vote the measure was approved. The council confirmed that it should be a live tree and expressed the recommendation that the tree be large enough to be easily visible in the sanctuary.



This fall, we are having an in-kind gathering of Lutheran World relief kit supplies. We will be assembling these in September and October and all donations are appreciated!

#### **SCHOOL KITS**

- Four 70 sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8x10; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ♦ One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- ♦ Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- ♦ Five blue or black ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ♦ One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ♦ One 2 ½" eraser

All items should be new. Any of these items you can donate will be greatly appreciated.

#### PERSONAL CARE KITS

- ♦ 1 light-weight bath-sized towel (20" x 40" to 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- ♦ 2 bath-size bars of soap (4-5 oz.) any brand in original wrapping
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging (Multipacks may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope. No plastic baggies, please)
- ♦ 1 metal nail clippers
- ♦ One sturdy comb

#### BABY CARE KITS

- ♦ · 2 receiving blankets
- ♦ 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- ♦ 1 hand towel, dark color recommended
- $\diamond$  2 bath-size bars (4-5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars

\*Sizes 6 to 25 months may be used. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.




