CHURCH COUNCIL minutes June 15, 2023 5:30 Meeting

Treasurer's Report by Randy Cook

Contributions and Expenses are running like the last few months.

We are overspending approximately \$2,000 per month.

Discussion – Tim Kenyon suggested the Finance Committee meet to discuss cashing in one of the CDs. Randy Cook stated most of the finance committee were in attendance at this council meeting, and a decision could be made at the time. Chuck Taylor questioned whether it was better to cash in one of the \$10,000 CDs now verses the \$5,000 one and have to do it again later. Old Business:

Electronic Offering: If we went with Venmo as an option we would need to have an old cell phone and number to use to activate google voice free of charge. "Tithing through ELCA" cost is \$50 per month -continue further discussion.

Christmas Tree Placement: tabled until the July/August meeting.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace: Adult Sunday school will be giving a \$20 monthly donation to help support the program. Update that checks will be sent in care of John Walsh, President of Union County.

Microphones: M/S/C by Mike Linch and Chuck Taylor to purchase a three-piece set like we have, with a microphone, transmitter, and receiver for \$629. As well as a charging base and rechargeable battery for \$249. The cost will come from replacement funds.

The Mediacom bill for phone and internet runs approximately \$250 per month. They do not have a cheaper package to purchase. Windstream does not cover the internet expense. Nothing will be changed at this time.

New Business:

July Benevolence: M/S/C by Randy Cook and Chuck Taylor to give to the Creston Area Food Pantry.

Committee Reports:

Christian Education: Four youth received Confirmation May 28, 2023

Church Property: Trenching for the electrical sign and yard repair will begin soon. Dirt work and reseeding will now take place this fall due to lack of rain. Glazing the upstairs windows will begin soon.

The weeds in the concrete have been sprayed.

Outreach Ministry: The Long Table Food Shelf is up and running. This has been well received by the community. We will be helping at the Food Pantry July 16, and serving One in Christ meals August 7th and 8th

Memorial Committee: A memorial has been given in Cliff Olsen's name with the family requesting it help with repair of the sanctuary ceiling. Additional funds have also been given in Linda Hultquist name. The remaining balance is 9,228.94. Total Memorial funds is \$12,212.36. 



During the months of July and August, Wal-Mart, Target, Dollar General, etc. have good sales on school supplies. Although we don't assemble them until September and October, the best time to purchase these items is July and August.

SCHOOL KITS

Each school kit includes:

- Four 70 sheet full sized notebooks-wide or college ruled paper;
 no loose-leaf paper
- ♦ One 30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ♦ One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- ♦ Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- ♦ Five blue or black ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ♦ One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ♦ One 2 ½" eraser

All items should be new. Any of these items you can donate will be greatly appreciated.


