#### Treasurer's Report by Mike Linch

Year to Date: \$81,000, Expenses \$99,000, Spending - \$12,5000,

Shortfall of \$5,000. One \$5,000 CD was cashed in

Received the housing allowance of \$5,400 (\$600 quarterly) and increase to Pastor's salary of \$10,00 year from endowment. This is now caught up.

Giving is down \$9,000 from a year ago. We will need to use cash reserves to cover expenses in the future. Currently we are meeting expenses.

Pastor's Report included visitations are going well. He is planning the installation of new members. Also see attached report in the newsletter.

#### Old Business:

Electronic Offering: Venmo will not be an option at this time as it must be linked to a personal cell phone, and this would mean the individual would not be able to use their account. In addition, they could be charged a fee at the end of the year.

M/S/C by Deb Pantini and Gary Boschee for Tithly, electronic giving through Synod, to be offered on a trial basis. This has a 3% fee to use. More information to come. (This is another option for contributions)

Church Property: Work on the sanctuary ceiling (by Simmons) will begin October 9. Al Gates has done a walk through and will work cooperatively on electrical with Simmons.

During the time work is being done services may be outside or in fellowship hall depending on weather. We had a leak around the chimney membrane on the old part of the roof, Hedberg's have been contacted and will be down to look at it.

Outreach Ministry: Prayer nights are going well with 17 signed up for Sept. 27. Salem assisted with Sleep in Heavenly Peace September 22. We assisted at the food pantry Sept. 17, with our next date Nov. 19. The Food shelf received another \$100 from the Juergen's family. This donation is now \$300. This has helped purchase items at the end of the month when we have open dates.

Worship & Music: has been planning services up to the holidays. The 4th Sunday in Advent is on Christmas Eve, so they are looking at possibly a short Sunday morning service in addition to the Christmas Eve service.

Stewardship: have discussed general stewardship and possibly sending letters out. Next meeting is October 4th.

Tabled at the SWCC Community Day for Salem outreach on 9/13.






